

# President's Message

#### President's Message - August 15, 2023

Good evening. Thank you all for coming.

I, along with some other owner members, recently attended the Public Hearing on the Atlantic Ave. expansion. While construction may not start for another two years, it was stated that only 21 homes, eight of them within CWL will be affected. No homes will be demolished as of that meeting. The right of ways will be changed along Atlantic Ave. and Jog Rd. Some of the homes that back up along Jog Rd. may also be affected.

On August 1st, First Service Residential, our management company, has provided notice to the Board that over the remainder of the year, several changes will occur with regards to financial operations. The most important one is that, for our members, the office will no longer be able to accept payments. Owners will have access to "Connect," the resident portal where online payments can be made and other information will be available to owners. Those who do not wish to use the online system will have to mail their payments. Around September Board meeting, we will have another session where you can 15th, members will receive a welcome letter explaining all the voice your comments. Please plan on staying and changes. Payments will still be due on the 1st of January, April, participating in the discussions. July and October. As always, payments received after the 15th of these months are considered late.

At the last Board meeting, there was a comment from a member on how much money has the Association spent on the repairs for the pool and hot tub. Upon some research, that number is approximately \$49,000 over the last eight years. The hot tub was placed back in service in 2015 after several years being inoperable. Both the pool and hot tub are 44 years old.

Perhaps it is time to think about future planning rather than knee-jerk responses to emergency repairs. Any seated Board has the fiduciary responsibility not only to maintain and repair but also to replace the Association amenities when repairs are no longer feasible. Discussions on this should occur by the current and future Boards of Directors.

We have now held three Town Hall Meetings regarding the proposed amendments. A recap of these discussions was included in the August newsletter. Tonight, after the regular

- Do not share personal information like your birth date or bank account number unless absolutely necessary. If you throw away documents with your personal information on them, shred them first.
- Bring your mail in every day to keep personal information or credit applications from sitting in your mailbox.
- Password protect all technology (laptops, smart phones, Wi-Fi).
- Install trusted antivirus and antispyware on your computer, and never download anything from a source you don't trust.

#### Did You Know?

- 1. Coco Wood Lakes will be 46 this year. It was incorporated in December 1977.
- 2. Coco Wood Lakes (CWL) has a set of documents complete with Rules & Regulations and Architectural Guidelines.
- 3. Everyone in CWL has agreed (at the time of purchase) to live according to the governing documents.
- At times, there are people who, on an ongoing basis, do not follow the governing documents.
- The CWL Board has the ability to levy penalties (fines) after a notice is sent to those owners who fail to follow the governing documents.

A committee of non-Board members decides whether or not the fine should be levied.

#### IMPORTANT VOTER INFORMATION

All Vote-by-Mail Requests submitted prior to the November 8, 2022 General Election have expired. New Election Laws require voters to renew their mail ballot requests after every General Election cycle.

Under the current Florida Laws, ALL Vote-By-Mail requests submitted prior to the November 8, 2022 General Election expired on December 31, 2022.

Voters who wish to receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot for the 2024 elections are required to complete a new Vote-by-Mail ballot request.

Updated Vote-by-Mail requests will be valid until December 31, 2024. After the next General Election, voters will need to make the request again, and it will need to be renewed after every General Election cycle for future elections.

Picture frames, doodads, knickknacks, etc. Please take those to Goodwill or Salvation Army, or someplace similar.

Finally, please do not re-shelve books when you return them. Please place them in the blue recycling bin we have provided for this purpose. The library committee will shelve them for you. And remember to call Jan if you have books to donate. Please do not just leave them at the library or in the lobby. We recently had a problem with a very large box of books that were left in the library. Most were unusable. Many were torn, soiled, from the "not accepted" list above, etc. Please be considerate. Observe the few rules we have so that all may enjoy the library.
