We do plan to have Bingo on June 2, but there will be no Bingo in July, August and possibly September or it may take place on a different day. Watch for updates.







Coco Wood Lakes is posted as a "No Soliciting" community. Every entrance to CWL is posted with "No Trespassing" and "No Soliciting" signs. If you are approached by someone soliciting in your neighborhood, attempt to obtain a business card from the person. Do not invite the person into your home and do not sign any paperwork from the person. Advise the person or persons that you are not interested. As soon as they leave your house, notify Kristine, our property manager, of the solicitor and any information you may have obtained.

If the office is closed, you can notify the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department at (561) 688-3000 or 911. Tell the dispatcher that our OAN number is 82945 and that our community is posted.

Remember, protect yourself. When you protect yourself, you also protect your community.

WARNING!!

Bufo toads pose a threat to pets and people alike. Pet owners are advised to take care when outside and minimize precautions when their animals are outside. When pets try to lick or pick up the toads in their mouths, the toads will release a highly toxic fine, milky secretion from the large paratoid glands on the back of their head. This toxic secretion can sicken or even kill animals that bite, lick or feed on the toads, including dogs, cats and native mammals, birds and snakes. Animals can die within 15 minutes of serious



exposure. The poison can also cause irritation to people's skin, as well, so experts recommend avoiding contact with bare hands.

If you suspect your pet has been exposed, it is recommended that you contact your veterinarian immediately. To help prevent encounters between these toads and your pet, it is recommended that you monitor pets and attractants around your home. The

Before you leave for the season remember to:

- 1) Bring inside the house or store inside your garage all of your patio furniture and all other loose items (tree benches, tree swings, garden/house decorations, pots and plants sitting at the surface of your garden/lawn). This keeps them from blowing away and potentially causing damage to your house or your neighbors house should a hurricane or severe storm hit the area.
- 2) Close your hurricane shutters (if applicable).
- 3) Trim all trees on your property and plan for landscaping maintenance while you are gone as well. Hiring a landscaper to come regularly to prune plants, water your landscaping and mow your lawn keeps your home looking nice even when you're not around and will prevent you from receiving a violation notice for not maintaining your yard. If you have an irrigation system, have it tested before leaving to ensure it works properly.
- 4) Do an overall inspection of your home to look for any potential problems before leaving, such as leaky pipes, rotted wood on the exterior, missing roof shingles, falling gutters or cracked windows. Repair those!
- 5) Prep your HVAC system for the summer months. Bump up your thermostat to 78° (auto/cool) so the air conditioning system still runs, but not as much. Keeping the system running prevents mold growth. Put in a fresh air filter before you leave. Consider scheduling one last seasonal preventive maintenance appointment with your HVAC Company, this ensures the system is ready to go for the long and hot summer season.
- 6) Shut off your water. Since no one will be there for several months, it's a good idea to shut off your main water valve to prevent leaks.
- 7) Remove all open food containers from pantry, do not leave perishable items in refrigerator and turn off ice maker.
- 8) Turn Off Water Heater (breaker).
- 9) Put bleach inside the toilet bowl and cover, also cover sinks and drains with plastic cling wrap. Covering those openings minimizes water evaporation in the trap, which in turn prevents sewer gases from entering your home.
- 10) Unplug any electric items that don't need to run while you're gone.
- 11) Lock all entrances: Manually lock your garage door from the inside before you leave. If possible, disconnect the power source to the garage door opener to prevent someone from accessing your home through the garage. Secure sliding glass doors with security bars. Lock all dead bolts and other locks on doors and windows.
- 12) If you can, hire a house watch services or make arrangements with a handyman to maintain your house periodically during the "off-season".
